Course 1: Thurs 6 & Fri 7 June Course 2: Sat 8 June & Sun 9 June

Day 1 includes: Introduction to Large Animal Rescue training, horse behaviour, practice the basic manoeuvres (forwards, rearwards, sideways) using the training mannequin horse

Day 2 includes: Accident scene risk assessments, introduction to use of the rescue glide, considerations for handling deceased horses with dignity at accident scenes (Day 1 is a pre-requisite)

- ✓ **Animal welfare management continuous improvement**

Day 1 & 2 are pre-requisites for “Day 3” to be delivered in the future, specifically aimed at horse events that have an attending equine veterinarian & “Day 4” for emergency services
